

What it means to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19



→ Am I fully vaccinated against COVID-19?



Fully vaccinated means you are “up to date” on your COVID-19 shots.

You are up to date if you have 1 dose of an updated COVID-19 shot.
The updated shot came out in September 2023. It protects you against the most current strains of the COVID-19 virus.

Here’s how to know if you’re up to date:

- If you got your latest COVID-19 shot after September 2023:
 - ↳ You got the updated shot, and you’re up to date!
- If you got your latest COVID-19 shot before September 2023:
 - ↳ You will need to get 1 Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, or Novavax updated shot
- If you have never had a COVID-19 shot, you will need to get either:
 - ↳ 1 updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna shot, **or** 2 updated Novavax shots




→ Do I have to keep getting COVID-19 shots?

Yes. Going forward the COVID-19 vaccine will be a yearly shot. This means you will need to get it once a year to stay up to date.
