

# Staying up to date with COVID-19 shots



→ Staying up to date with your COVID-19 shots protects you against the most current strains of the COVID-19 virus.



Going forward the COVID-19 shot will be a **yearly shot**. This means everyone will need to get it once a year to stay up to date.

## If you are not immunocompromised:

### If you are an adult under age 65:

And you got your latest COVID-19 shot **after September 2023:**

You got the updated shot, and you're up to date!

And you got your latest COVID-19 shot **before September 2023:**

You will need 1 updated Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, or Novavax shot

And you have **never had a COVID-19 shot**, you will need either:

2 updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna shots

or

2 updated Novavax shots followed by 1 updated shot from any company

or

### If you are age 65 or older:

And your latest COVID-19 shots were **2 doses after September 2023:**

You're up to date!

And your latest COVID-19 shot was **1 dose after September 2023:**

You will need 1 more updated Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, or Novavax shot

And your latest COVID-19 shot was **before September 2023:**

You will need 2 updated Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, or Novavax shots

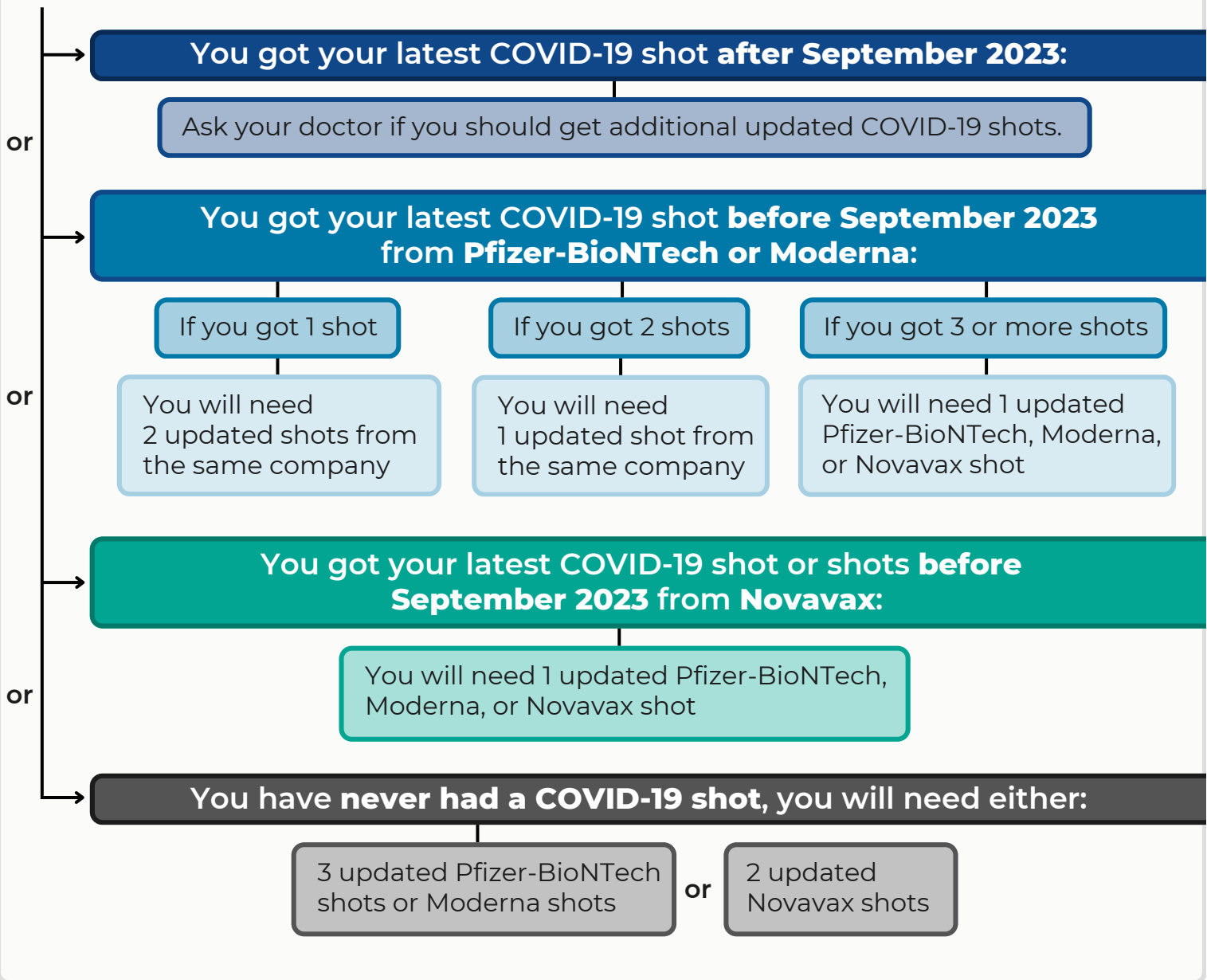
And you have **never had a COVID-19 shot**, you will need either:

2 updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna shots

or

2 updated Novavax shots followed by 1 updated shot from any company


If you are immunocompromised, and:

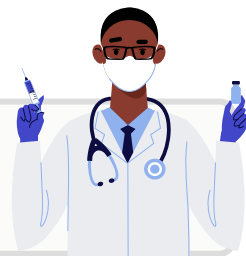


In any case, ask your doctor if you need additional updated COVID-19 shots.
